A Person with Integrity

There is a wealthy man in the Bible story named Job residing in an area called Uz with his extended family and vast flocks. He is described as "a man who was honest, a person of absolute integrity; he feared God and avoided evil." [Job 1:1, Common English Bible]

One day, this Job is given four reports, each informing him that his sheep, servants, and ten children have all died due to thieving intruders and natural disasters. Job rips his clothes and shaves his head in sorrow, yet he still praises God in his prayers. In today's passage, Job is distressed with terrible skin sores. Even his wife urges him to denounce God and to give up and die. What would you do if you were in such a circumstance that Job was facing?

Over the month of October, let us read together about this man with integrity. What must we learn from Job and how can we respond to unexpected suffering in the midst of our faith journeys?
