







"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit." Galatians 5:22-23, 25

The month of May brings a sense of 'love and appreciation' to our family and community which begins with Cinco de Mayo for families from Mexico, Mother's Day for all women, and Memorial Day for all public service men and women, especially those who serve our country with their lives.

During the quarantine, how can we recognize this sense of 'love and appreciation' to friends from different cultures, to our mothers or spouses, and to those who are in uniform for our community, city and country? Since we are physically set apart, staying-at-home for many days, how do we express our emotions toward our own family or neighbors, who are close to us, often living in a same building or community? Yes, we may feel cautious, stressed, distanced and even isolated, but we still need to learn how to be ourselves as witnesses of the risen Christ, and grow stronger through this uncertain challenge caused by Covid-19.

One of my friends recently recommended a book series written by Dr. Gary Chapman. It is about 5 different languages for love: "The 5 Love Languages." Probably, many of you have already read or learned about it. Obviously, these 5 languages are not like the languages I learned such as English, Hebrew, or Greek in school, but without knowing these languages for love, we are literally not able to communicate well or can misunderstand someone, especially those close to us. Dr. Chapman says, "Your emotional love language and the language of your spouse may be as different as Chinese from English. No matter how hard you try to express love in English, if your spouse understands only Chinese, you will never understand how to show love to each other. Being sincere is not enough. We must be willing to learn our spouse's primary love language if we are to be an effective communicator of love."

These "5 Love Languages" are 'Words of Affirmation,' 'Quality Time,' 'Receiving Gifts,' 'Acts of Service,' and 'Physical Touch.' Dr. Chapman pointed out that unless we grew up with all these different languages, we may have only the ability to primarily communicate with one or two of these languages but not all. That means we must understand "some individuals will know instantaneously their own primary love language and that of their loved one. For others, it will not be that easy. So, the key is to learn the primary love language of your loved one and choose to speak it."

Do you know what? I have just ordered a couple of Audible books in Dr. Chapman's series (free for 30 days in Amazon) and listened a few chapters. I applied what I learned to Mia who was about to go to the church office this morning, "You look good today and I love you!" (Words of Affirmation). Then, she replied back, "I will make chicken sandwiches for your lunch." (Acts of Service). Wow! It works. I believe that Dr. Chapman truly shares his wisdom from his Christian faith to his audience wherever they are and whatever spoken language they use. At one time, he and his wife committed to be in Africa to teach and preach the Gospel of the risen Christ. However, because of his wife's health, they could not go to Africa, which brought disappointment and disturbance to them for years. Now, in his own confession, "We just realized 'Sovereignty of God' over our lives, prepared us and used our stories which have been translated into 38 different languages."

Over the month of May, we continue to retrieve the journey of the risen Christ Jesus who appeared to his loved ones with signs, gestures and languages. We can imagine how comforting and joyful those might be. In the meantime, I continue to pray with you for 'Fruit of the Holy Spirit' while we make tangible acts of fruitfulness each and everyday of our faith journey. May the peace of the risen Christ be with you! May the love of God through Jesus empower us to love one another! Amen.


### **Pastor John's Sermon Series**


