In fact, it is a time for us to build healthy boundaries (plans & strategies) in diligence: tie up plants to support sticks so they grow taller and stronger and water them every evening or morning. After all, it matters how we practice and discipline ourselves during this challenging season.

Our spiritual practices and disciplines are also meant to be greener, growing, and glowing during this upcoming summer season. Although I am very grateful for your ongoing efforts to join online worship and prayers during this Pandemic, we cannot deny that we are still facing a significant transition of the church, which can be also an opportunity. How to be or identify ourselves as a worshipful, prayerful, and missional 'Doers of the Word'?

Alan Hirsch, the author of 'The Permanent Revolution' said, "the Church that Jesus built is designed for growth—and massive, highly transformative growth at that... It is designed to be an advancing, untamed and untamable, revolutionary force created to transform the world." I believe it is a liminal but adventurous time for Mercer Island UMC to pray together and envision together a church in the Book of Acts and we will be an evangelical group to spread the Gospel with our own authentic stories. 

How do you know what to do?


A little loam, a kiss of the sun,


And gentle rain from the heavens above;

On behalf of all of us at LIHI, thank you for your time and effort in building a tiny house! This will make a big difference in improving lives for people experiencing homelessness.

LOW INCOME

We are excited to share that the tiny house you built has been placed at a new village in the Central Area, T. C. Spirit Village, located at 612 22nd Ave, Seattle, WA 98122. The tiny house is already providing a safe space for someone experiencing homelessness to sleep behind their very own locking door. In response to the COVID-19 crisis, you are helping us with rapidly setting up additional shelter capacity for our unhoused neighbors who are especially vulnerable to exposure. We could not have done this without generous community champions like you!

The twelve tiny house villages LIHI operates provide shelter, community and safety to 1,000 people annually including single adults, couples, families with kids, and pets. Village case managers work individually with each resident to help them obtain long-term housing, employment, health care, education, child care, treatment and other services. Over the past four years, case managers have successfully transitioned over 550 residents into permanent housing. We could not do this crucial work without you, and we are immensely grateful for your contribution

Thank you again for supporting the tiny house program and working alongside us in helping to solve homelessness in our region. We look forward to our continued work together!


