The Fall and the Spring both have their own stories to tell.



Missional works through our United Methodist Church



We'd like to reach out because we have gotten permission that we can have volunteer groups up to 5 people (masked, distancing, etc) from local churches. (Or, if they stay completely separated, we can have multiple groups of 5 at the same time, as well.) It is our understanding that this can

happen regardless of where the local church is in the Reopening plan. If there are some folks from a local church who are itching to get out and do some projects, we are at the beginning part of renovating Madrona (formerly Chak Chak), as well as plenty to do around camp, and we have plenty of work that volunteers could help with. I know traditionally men's groups have been the most prominent volunteers, or we have plenty of stuff for any groups who were wanting to come help out.

We want to share with you a unique invitation to partner with us in ministry. The Bellevue First UMC leadership council has been studying ways we can provide support to those with housing insecurity in our local community. In the past, we had operated a small transitional housing shelter in our current building. A while back this shelter was closed down

because it lacked basic amenities. From this experience, we have learned how to construct a better version of this shelter - an "efficiency studio" that will include: a private outside entrance, a bathroom complete with shower, a full studio apartment-sized kitchen, enough space for up to four people to live efficiently, and hookups for a stackable washer/dryer.

We are asking you to consider supporting this project financially. Regardless of the size of a donation, your gift can make an impact far beyond this present season. Our hope is that this shelter becomes a legacy, and we want you to be a part of that. 
